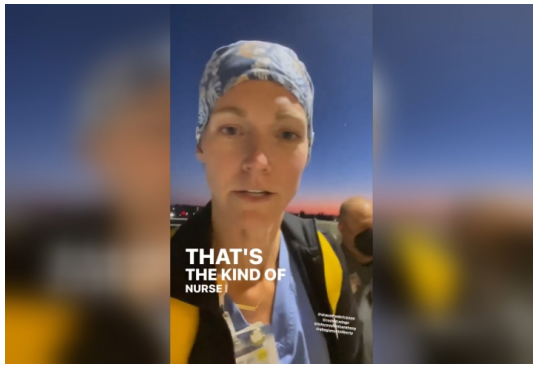

April Luncheon

Due to unforeseen circumstances, we have had a change of speaker for our April event. However, a change of speaker does not mean a change in importance or relevance. **You're going to want to hear what Tori Jensen has to say about medical tyranny, how it is here to stay, how to protect yourself and how to wake up others.** She endured a very public firing by Kaiser Permanente for refusing to get the Covid vaccine. **Here** is a news story about her ordeal and brave stance. She has a podcast, Declare Truth, that focuses on medical freedom and is a member of California Nurses Unite, a group of registered nurses working to prevent the HPV vaccine from being mandated and to

protect your right to make your own health care choices.



Tori Jensen

Tori Jensen is a registered nurse and dietitian, living in San Diego, with her husband and two daughters. After losing her hospital job, she started a nutrition coaching business where she teaches women how to simplify what it means to get healthy and lose the weight for good.

Follow her lawsuit and get up to date information on the medical freedom movement in California by following her podcast Declare Truth.

Tori Jensen, a long-standing 10-year nurse, has been with Kaiser Permanente hospital in Carlsbad, California for 5 years. On October 28th, 2021, Tori Jensen, a mother of two with a husband who is a firefighter, was working on the COVID Unit during the Pandemic at Kaiser Permanente, when she was escorted out during her work shift. Her request was denied for a religious exemption from the COVID-19 vaccination and placed on an unpaid administrative leave. Tori Jensen filmed herself from her phone as she was escorted out. In the video that went viral with over 7 million views in just 3 days, Jensen states, “I am being escorted out of Kaiser Permanente Hospital for my religious beliefs, because I don’t want to receive ‘the jab.’” After 8 hours of trying to receive answers from Human Resources, she was then informed that she was being placed on ‘unpaid administrative leave.’

VOLUNTEER ACTION

Spring is in the air and sunshine will brighten our way. Since we're close to an election year, there will be many opportunities to volunteer. There will be candidates and initiatives that will need our support. At the March luncheon I presented Carl DeMaio's California Election Integrity Initiative. Its goal is to restore election integrity to our state by holding our state and local officials accountable for cleaning up the voter lists, requiring voter ID verification for in-person and mail-in ballots, and providing transparency on polling locations on election day and holding them accountable for solving any problems that may come up.

There was a question asked that I did not have an answer for at that time

and I would like to address it, after some research. The question was, how can mail-in signatures truly be validated? According to Carl Demaio, the way it stands now, Shirley Weber, secretary of state, passed a regulation that allows for signatures on mail-in ballots to be accepted even if they don't look anything like the real signature. The Election Integrity Initiative would overturn that regulation, then having reliable people to open the envelopes and truly verify signatures comparing them to the signatures on driver's licenses, would offer some due diligence against fraudulent ballots. The fact that you could scrutinize signatures and reject bad ones, would be a new concept for the California Democrat party election officials. Carl stated that he has already tried this system and it works! According to him, if the Initiative passes, this can't be challenged. I'm sure this system is not perfect, but I would say it is an improvement on what we have now, unless we utilize fingerprints, as Jonathon Ingram, former Chairman of the Riverside GOP recommended, which doesn't sound like a bad idea.

If you have any other questions, you can also go on the electionintegrityinitiative.com website and watch Carl's webinar that explains the initiative in more detail. Please be aware that the goal is to file the initiative by August. Hit the ground running collecting signatures by Fall. Qualify by mid-April 2024 to be on the November General Election Ballot. This initiative would not take effect until the elections after 2024. It was not possible to have passed it by the November 2024 General Election because initiatives are voted on only in general elections. As you can see, we're going to need lots of volunteers. See me, Maria, at one of our luncheons or call me at 951-551-7626. I still need 3 more people to complete my team. You can also form your own groups of 5. Please let me know so we can plan accordingly.

Other opportunities: Please go review history and social science books that are on display at the Murrieta Valley School District. We need to check them for Critical Race Theory, as they are being considered to become part of their curriculum. They will be on display until the end of April. The address is 41870 McAlby Court, Murrieta. Let's stop CRT before it hits the classrooms!
